Sask Sport October Athlete of the Month and 2018 IWWF Female Disabled Athlete of the Year – Ashley Baerg

Competing in the 2018 USA Adaptive National Waterski Championships, Baerg broke her previous world record in the jump category of 17.2 metres by posting a 17.9 m mark. She placed first in all her events, achieving the highest overall cost score of all women in all classifications.



This outstanding tournament performance and achievement, resulted in Ashley being awarded the International Waterski & Wakeboard Federation (IWWF) 2018 IWWF Female Disabled Athlete of the Year award.
