



## **Risk Management Practice Workshops for Boards**

RespectED for Sport, Culture and Recreation in Saskatchewan 2009-2010

These sessions are focussed on helping organizations to understand the implementation of their Risk Management tools as they relate to the safety of children and youth. Using detailed fictional case examples of abuse, harassment, bullying and hazing the participants will be assisted in working through a number of complaints/incidents from first reporting to resolution.

These sessions will help “bring to life” the risk management policies, protocols, codes of conduct and screening procedures they already have in place. Board members roles and responsibilities during a complaint process will be discussed and reviewed along with important issues like conflict of interest, confidentiality and document retention.

The sessions are facilitated by the RespectED Project and Support Line Coordinator for the Canadian Red Cross in Saskatchewan – Bruce Wood.

Attendees will also receive a Red Cross “Ten Steps to Creating safe Environments” Manual and a CD that contains numerous policy, procedure and code of conduct templates.

## **Risk Management Sessions for Boards of Directors**

RespectED for Sport, Culture and Recreation in Saskatchewan 2009-2010

These sessions are focussed on assisting organizations with their Risk Management practices as they relate to the safety of children and youth. In these workshops attendees will learn about:

- The need for comprehensive policies and practices in ensuring the safety of children and youth in regards to abuse, harassment, bullying and hazing.
- The “duty of care” and the “standard of care” that organizations are obliged to attend to in delivering and supporting programming, and
- The six “P”s of a comprehensive approach to Risk Management practice.

Attendees will receive a Red Cross “Ten Steps to Creating safe Environments” Manual and a CD that contains numerous policy, procedure and code of conduct templates.
