She has also been a member of the Community Initiatives Fund, the Rainbow Youth Centre, and Family Service Regina's Board of Directors.

Young replaces outgoing President Dale Holmes who will remain on the board as Past President. Nominated to the board in 2007 by Basketball Saskatchewan, Holmes has served as Chairperson of the Audit Committee and Administration Center Advisory Committee, as well as the KidSport™ Saskatchewan Provincial Committee, Lottery Division Committee, Sport Committee, and the Future Best Committee. Previously, he was the head coach of Leboldus High School's senior boys' basketball team, and he has been involved with Basketball Saskatchewan for more than a decade.
