

Required Follow Up

Grants must be spent in the year in which they are given. Grant recipients will be required to submit a completed "Summary Report", including financial accounting by September 30 each year.

The following items will not be considered for funding:

- Computers for administrative purposes
- On going administrative or office expenses
- Ongoing salaries, or honoraria for coaches, officials, or administrators
- Uniforms
- Endowment Funds

Success Stories

Wind On My Wings Sailing Club in Regina used a contribution from the Foundation (along with other sponsors) to build a 50 foot floating dock to allow people with disabilities interested in sailing to be able to access the sailboats and sail on Wascana Lake in Regina.

Philosophy of the Foundation

One of the goals of the Jeux Canada Games is to leave a heritage of physical and human resources in both the host community and the province.

The 1989 Jeux Canada Games left Saskatoon and Saskatchewan with legacies in facilities, community development and sport. Sport equipment from the Games was distributed to communities and organizations throughout the province for use by amateur athletes.

The 1989 Jeux Canada Games Foundation was established with funds remaining after completion of the Games. The Foundation distributes the interest accrued on the invested funds on an annual basis to assist in the development of amateur sport in Saskatchewan.

Guidelines for Applications

1. The Foundation gives priority to proposals that leave long-lasting benefits to amateur sport in Saskatchewan. Creative proposals which assist in the development of amateur sports, coaching and grassroots sport development also receive consideration.
2. Applicants must be registered provincially or federally as a non-profit corporation.
3. Applications must include the following
 - The Association's non-profit corporation number and a listing of current members of the Board of Directors according to the provincial government's Corporations Branch
 - The previous year's audited financial statement or a financial statement signed by 2 Directors
 - A development plan for how the money will be used by the organization
 - A budget for the specific project indicating all funding sources
 - A listing of current staff and contact information

How to Apply

Applications must be made on the application form available on the web site. All information listed in the "Guidelines for Applications" section must be provided. Incomplete applications will not be considered. **Applicants are encouraged to phone Tom Kenedy at 306-251-1989 or email 1989jcgf@sasktel.net before completing an application** with questions about eligibility and to make sure their application is complete and appropriate under the guidelines established.

Deadlines for Applications

Applications must be postmarked on or before **November 30 each year**. Emailed and applications with scanned support documents (pdf's) are encouraged. Those who apply are encouraged to keep a backup copy of their application for record keeping purposes. Grants tend to be in the range of \$2,500 to \$10,000 although all grant levels will be considered.
